


Figure 1, Type I Camera Overview




Figure 2, Type II Camera Overview




Figure 3, Type III Camera Overview




Figure 4, Type IV Camera Overview




Figure 5, Type V Camera Overview

### 2 Installation

### Before you start:

- Make sure the device in the package is in good condition and all the assembly parts are included.
- The standard power supply is 12 VDC or PoE (802.3 af), please make sure your power supply matches your camera.
- Make sure all the related equipment is powered off during the installation.
- Check the specification of the products for the installation environment.
- Make sure that the wall is strong enough to withstand four times the weight of the camera and the bracket.

For cameras that support IR, pay attention to the following precautions to prevent IR reflection:

- Dust or grease on the dome cover will cause IR reflection. Do not remove the dome cover film until the installation is finished. If there is dust or grease on the dome cover, clean the dome cover with a clean soft cloth and isopropyl alcohol.
- Make sure there is no reflective surface too close to the camera lens.
   The IR light from the camera may reflect back into the lens causing reflection.
- The foam ring around the lens must be seated flush against the inner surface of the bubble to isolate the lens from the IR LEDS. Fasten the dome cover to the camera body so that the foam ring and the dome cover are attached seamlessly.

# 2.1 Memory Card Installation

For camera models that support a memory card as local storage, you can follow the steps to mount and unmount the memory card.

This camera series shares a similar structure, type III camera is used as

an example.

 Loosen the screws on the bubble and remove to expose memory card slot.




Figure 6, Remove Bubble

**NOTES:** To prevent loss, screws on the bubble cannot be removed completely.

- 3. (Optional) To unmount the memory card, push to eject.

## 2.2 Ceiling Mounting

This camera series shares a similar structure. A type III camera is used for this example.

- 1. Paste the drill template to desired mounting place.
- 2. Drill the screw holes on the ceiling according to the drill template.




Figure 8, Drill Template

**NOTES**: If you choose to route cable through the ceiling, cut a cable hole according to Hole A on drill template.

You can also route cable from the side outlet.

If you install the camera outdoors, install the waterproof jacket to the network cable. See Section 2.4.




Figure 9, Side Outlet

Route the cables and fix the mounting base on the ceiling with three screws.




Figure 10, Fix the Mounting Base

- Adjust surveillance angle. See the figure of each camera type for detailed angle adjustment range.
  - Loosen one tilting adjust adjusting screw to adjust the tilting position. Tighten the screw after adjustment.
  - 2). Hold the black liner to adjust the panning position.
  - 3). Hold the lens to adjust the rotating position.

**NOTE:** Rotating position adjustment is not supported by Type I cameras.





Figure 11, Angle Adjustment of Type I Camera

Figure 12, Angle Adjustment of Type II Camera




Figure 13, Angle Adjustment of Type III Camera

### 2.3 Mounting with Brackets

This camera series supports mounting with wall mounting bracket, pendant mounting bracket, and incline mounting bracket. We take a Type III camera as the example.

### 2.3.1 Wall Mounting

The wall mounting bracket is not included in the package. You need to prepare one if you adopt this mounting type.

1. Mark the screw holes on desired mounting location.




Figure 15, Mark Screw Hole

- 2. Drill four screw holes for expansion screws.
- Unscrew the bubble of the camera.

- 4. (Optional) Insert the memory card to the camera if your camera supports memory card installation. Refer to Section 2.1.
- Route the cables and fix the camera to the cap of the wall mounting bracket with three supplied self-tapping screws.




Figure 16, Fix the Camera to Wall Mounting Bracket

6. Align the wall mounting bracket to the screw holes and fix it to wall.

NOTE: If you install the camera outdoors, install the waterproof jacket to the network cable. See Section 2.4.




Figure 17, Fix the Wall Mounting Bracket to Wall

- 7. Adjust surveillance angle of camera. Refer to Step 4 in Section 2.2.
- 8. Install the bubble back to the camera.




Figure 18, Install the Bubble

### 2.3.2 Wall Mounting with Junction Box

The wall mounting bracket with junction box is not included in the package. You need to prepare one if you adopt this mounting type.

- 1. Mark the screw holes on desired mounting location.
- 2. Fix the bracket to the wall with four expansion bolts.




Figure 19, Fix the Bracket

3. Unscrew the junction box cover.




Figure 20, Unscrew the Cover

Route and connect the cables. Source cables of network, power, etc., go in from the side outlet of the junction box. Camera cables go in from the cap and the bracket.

NOTE: If you install the camera outdoors, install the waterproof jacket to the network cable. See Section 2.4.

5. Screw the cover back on.




Figure 21, Cable Routing

- 6. Unscrew the bubble from the camera.
- (Optional) Insert the memory card to the camera if your camera supports memory card installation. Refer to Section 2.1.
- Fix the camera to the cap of the wall mounting bracket with three supplied self-tapping screws.




Figure 23, Install the Bubble

### 2.3.3 Pendant Mounting

The pendant mounting bracket is not included in the package. You need to prepare one in advance if you adopt this mounting type.

- 1. Mark the screw holes on desired mounting place.
- 2. Drill three screw holes for expansion bolts.
- 3. Route the cables and fix the pendant mounting bracket to ceiling.




Figure 24, Fix Pendant Mount

- (Optional) Insert the memory card to the camera, if your camera supports memory card installation. Refer to Section 2.1.
- Fix the camera to the cap of the pendant mounting bracket with three supplied self-tapping screws.




Figure 25, Fix the Camera to Cap




Figure 26, Install the Cap

- 6. Screw the cap to the pendant mounting bracket.
- 7. Adjust surveillance angle of camera. Refer to Step 4 in Section 2.2.
- 8. Install the bubble back to the camera.

### 2.3.4 Incline Mounting

The incline mounting bracket is not included in the package. You need to prepare one if you adopt this mounting type.

Paste the drill template to desired mounting place.




Figure 27, Drill Template

- 2. Drill two screw holes for expansion screws, and a cable hole according to the template.
- 3. Fix the incline mounting bracket to ceiling.




Figure 28, Fix Incline Mounting Bracket to Wall

- 4. Unscrew the bubble of the camera.
- (Optional) Insert the memory card to the camera if your camera supports memory card installation. Refer to Section 2.1.
- Route the cables and fix the camera to the incline mounting bracket with three supplied self-tapping screws.




Figure 29, Fix the Camera to Wall Mounting Bracket

# 2.4 (Optional) Network Cable Waterproof Jacket Installation

### Purpose:

If the camera is installed outdoors, you can use the waterproof accessory for the network cable after the camera is secured on the installation surface.




Figure 31, Waterproof Accessory Components

- Feed the plugless network cable (7) through the lock nut (6), waterproof rubber gasket (5) (rubber gasket inset ridge must face waterproof endcap), and the waterproof endcap (4) in order.
- Crimp an RJ-45 network plug 3 onto the end of the cable, taking care to insert the twisted pairs of wires in correct order.
- Place the O-type gasket ② onto the end of the camera's network interface socket ①.
- 4. Insert the network plug  $\ \mathfrak{J}$  into the camera's network interface socket  $\ \mathfrak{D}$ .
- Insert the waterproof rubber gasket (3) into the waterproof endcap (4), and secure lock nut (6) with the waterproof endcap (4).
- 6. Align the snap on the waterproof endcap (4) with the notch on the camera's network interface socket (1), and then secure the waterproof endcap (4) to the camera's network interface socket (1) to finish installation.




Figure 32, Waterproof Accessory Installation




Figure 34, Connecting via a Switch or a Router

# 3.2 Activate the Camera

**Network Camera** 

You are required to activate the camera first by setting a strong password for it before you can use the camera.

Activation via web browser, activation via SADP, and activation via client software are all supported. We will take activation via SADP software and activation via web browser as examples to introduce the camera activation.

**NOTE:** Refer to the User Manual of Network Camera for Activation via Client Software.

## 3.2.1 Activation via Web Browser

- Power on the camera. Connect the camera to your computer or the switch/router your computer connects to.
- Input the IP address into the address bar of the Web browser, and press Enter to enter the activation interface.

NOTES: The default IP address of the camera is 192.168.1.64.

The computer and the camera should belong to the same subnet.

For cameras that enable DHCP by default, you need to use the SADP software to search for the IP address.

3. Create a password and input the password into the password field.

- 5. Click **OK** to save the password and enter the live view interface.

### 3.2.2 Activation via SADP Software

SADP software is used for detecting online devices, activating cameras, and resetting passwords.

Get the SADP software from the supplied disk or the official Website, and install the SADP according to the prompts.

Follow the steps to activate the camera.

- 1. Run the SADP software to search the online devices.
- Check the device status from the device list, and select the inactive device.

Create and input the new password in the password field, and confirm the password.

**NOTE:** You can enable the Hik-Connect service for the device during activation. Refer to Chapter 5.1 for detailed information.

Click Activate to start activation.

NOTE: You can check whether the activation is completed on the pop-up window. If activation failed, make sure that the password meets the requirement and try again.

# 3.3 Modify the IP Address

#### Purpose:

To view and configure the camera via a LAN (Local Area Network), you need to connect the network camera in the same subnet as your PC.

Use the SADP software or client software to search and change the IP address of the device. We take modifying the IP Address via SADP software as an example to introduce the IP address modification.

For IP address modification via client software, refer to the user manual of client software.

- 1. Run the SADP software.
- 2. Select an active device.
- Change the device IP address to the same subnet as your computer by either modifying the IP address manually or checking Enable DHCP.

Web Browser: Internet Explorer 8.0 and above version, Mozilla Firefox 30.0–51, Google Chrome 31.0–44, Apple Safari 8.0 and above version

- Open the Web browser.
- In the browser address bar, input the IP address of the network camera, and press the **Enter** key to enter the login interface.

NOTE: The default IP address is 192.168.1.64. You are recommended to change the IP address to the same subnet as your computer.

- 3. Input the user name and password.
  - NOTE: The admin user should configure the device accounts and user/operator permissions properly. Delete unnecessary accounts and user/operator permissions.

The device IP address locks if the admin user performs seven failed password attempts (five attempts for the user/operator).

Click Login.

Install the plug-in before viewing the live video and managing the camera. Follow the installation prompts to install the plug-in.

**NOTE**: You may have to close the Web browser to finish the plug-in installation.

# 5 Operate via Hik-Connect App

#### Purpose:

Hik-Connect is an application for mobile devices. With the app, you can view live image of the camera, receive alarm notifications, etc.

NOTE: Hik-Connect service is not supported by certain camera models

#### 5.1 Enable Hik-Connect Service on Camera

#### Purpose:

Enable Hik-Connect service on your camera before using the service. You can enable the service through SADP software or a Web browser.

# 5.1.1 Enable Hik-Connect Service via SADP Software

- Check the Enable Hik-Connect checkbox on:
  - "Activate the Device" page during camera activation (see Chapter 3.2.2.) or "Modify Network Parameters" page when modifying IP address (see Chapter 3.3).
  - 2). Create a verification code or change the verification code.




Figure 39, Verification Code Setting (SADP)

**NOTE:** The verification code is required when adding the camera to the Hik-Connect app.

2. Click and read "Terms of Service" and "Privacy Policy."

3. Confirm the settings.

#### 5.1.2 Fnable Hik-Connect Service via Web Browser

#### Before you start:

You need to activate the camera before enabling the service. See Chapter 3.2.

- Access the camera via a Web browser. Refer to Chapter 4.
- Enter platform access configuration interface: Configuration > Network > Advanced Settings > Platform Access.

- 3. Select Platform Access Mode as Hik-Connect.
- 4. Check Enable.
- Click and read "Terms of Service" and "Privacy Policy" in pop-up window.
- Create a verification code or change the verification code for the camera.

**NOTE:** The verification code is required when you add the camera to the Hik-Connect app.

Save the settings.

## 5.2 Hik-Connect Setup

 Download and install the Hik-Connect app by searching for "Hik-Connect" in the iOS App Store or Google Play™.

- 2. Launch the app and register for a Hik-Connect user account.
- 3. Log in to the Hik-Connect app after registration.

### 5.3 Add Camera to Hik-Connect

#### Before you start:

You need to enable the Hik-Connect service on camera before adding it to your Hik-Connect account. Refer to Chapter 5.1.

 Use a network cable to connect the camera to a router if the camera does not support Wi-Fi.

NOTE: After the camera connects to the network, wait one minute before any operation on the camera using the Hik-Connect app.

2. In the Hik-Connect app, tap "+" on the upper-right corner, and then scan the camera's QR code to add the camera.

**NOTE:** You can find the QR code on the camera or on the camera's Quick Start Guide cover in the package.




Figure 42, Scan QR Code

NOTE: If the QR code is missing or too blurry to be recognized, you can also add the camera by tapping the icon and inputting the camera's serial number.

3. Input your camera's verification code.

NOTE: The verification code is the code you created or changed when you enabled Hik-Connect service on the camera.

If you forgot the verification code, you can check the current verification code on the **Platform Access** configuration page via a Web browser

Follow the prompts to set the network connection and add the camera to your Hik-Connect account.

**NOTE:** For detailed information, refer to the Hik-Connect user manual.

# 5.4 Initialize the Memory Card

Check the memory card status by tapping on the Storage Status in the Device Settings interface.

If the memory card status displays as Uninitialized, tap to initialize it. The status will then change to Normal. You can then start recording any event triggered video in the camera such as motion detection.
